Courses and Qualifications

We run courses at all levels from Elementary (A1) to Advanced (C1). **Please note that we do not offer Beginners classes and those coming to the UK on a student visa will need to study a course at the Upper-Intermediate (B2) level or above.**

You will be given an initial assessment test to ensure you are placed in the correct level when you arrive at the College. The test will include a reading and writing test, a grammar assessment and a short interview. Teachers will also work with you throughout your time at the College to ensure that you are studying at the best level for you.

All Pre-Intermediate and above courses lead to one or more of the following internationally recognised Cambridge qualifications:

- Key English Test (KET)
- Preliminary English Test (PET)
- First Certificate in English (FCE)
- Certificate of Advanced English (CAE)
- International English Language Testing System (IELTS)

When will I study?

For all levels, you can choose to start in September, January or April and examinations are run in December and June. Depending on the amount of tuition required, you can take between one term (12 weeks) to one academic year (36 weeks) to complete your course:

Autumn term

September to December

Spring term

January to April

Summer term

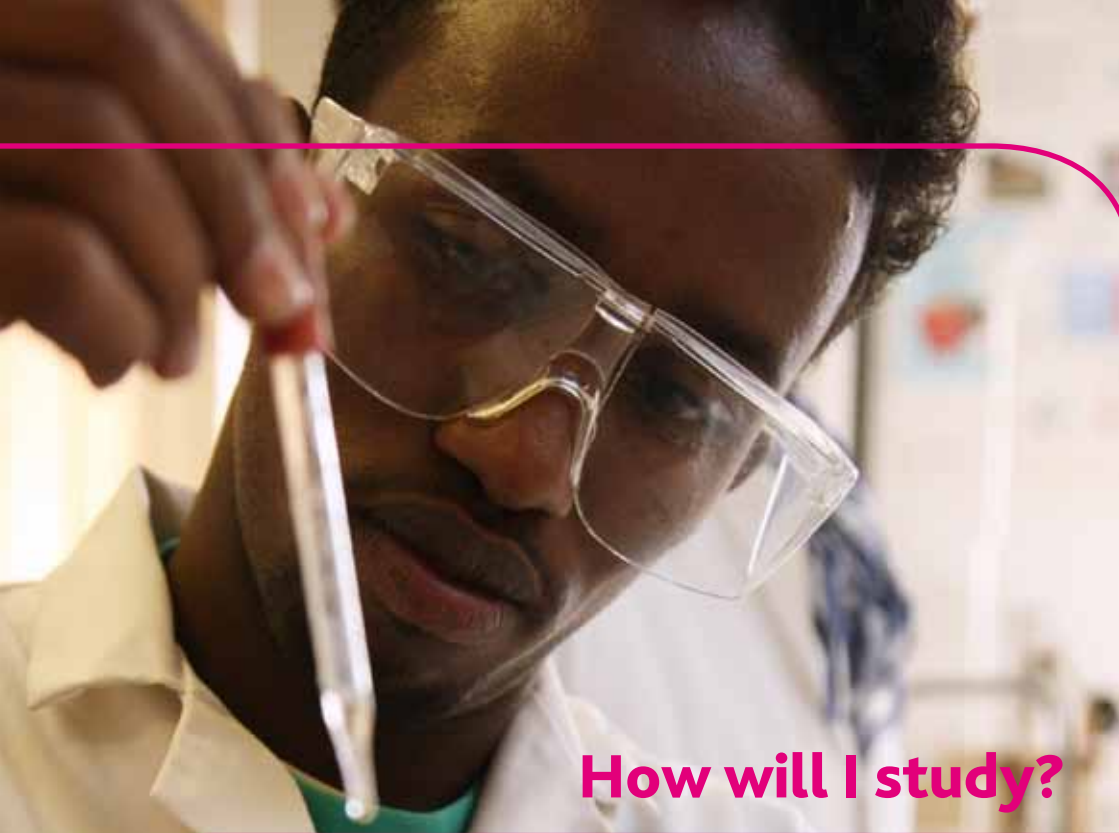
April to July

Please note that actual dates will be confirmed in your offer letter.

If you are in the UK on a student visa, you will need to study the course full-time, which is currently 16 hours per week. We also offer 6 hour and 10 hour per week options for students without visa restrictions.

How will I study?

At each level, you will practise the four language skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing. You will also spend time on grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation.

All our classrooms are equipped with the latest state-of-the-art technology, such as interactive whiteboards and laptop computers for students.

As well as learning in class, you will have a personal tutor and attend one-to-one tutorials. Throughout the course, you will receive homework and undergo regular progress tests.

The Learning Resources Centre is also there to support you in your learning. Here, you can study, read newspapers, watch English Language DVDs, listen to CDs, use computers and access the Internet.

Additionally, all international students at the College are eligible for our free extra-curricular events programme. We have a variety of events taking place throughout the year which are designed to introduce you to different aspects of life in London, as well as enable you to practise your English with fellow students.

Fees

A one year full-time EFL course at any level costs **£3300 for international students.**

Shorter courses and part-time options are priced per term and can be calculated using the table on page 3 of this brochure.

The fees include:

- Registration and enrolment
- Tuition and testing
- Examination entry
- Membership of the Learning Resources Centre and Students Union
- Learning materials *(but not course-books, which must be purchased individually at an average cost of £20-£30)*

Once you have been offered a place on a programme, you will be asked to pay 50% of the course fee in order to accept your place and, if required, receive a Confirmation of Acceptance to Study (CAS) letter to support your student visa application. You will then pay the balance of your fees at enrolment.

Don't worry about losing money if your visa is refused - any fees you have paid will be refunded if your visa application is not successful (minus a small administrative charge).

Please note that we are only able to accept bank transfers for payment of fees. Credit and debit cards can only be used if the card-owner is paying in person at the College.
